Being consistent and modelling family beliefs and values



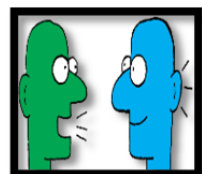
Thinkers

Asking your child deep questions – Why?



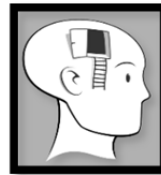
Caring

CWA Eco-corner



Great news! Starting Monday, May 7, 2018, a new weekly composting food waste collection will be extended to most LaSalle residences, including our CWA school.

DID YOU KNOW?

On average, food waste accounts for 27% of the household waste found in Montrealers' garbage bags. By taking part in the composting food waste collection, you will be making it possible to divert these waste materials from landfills and other waste disposal sites.

WHAT IS COMPOSTABLE FOR CITY OF MONTREAL FOOD WASTE COLLECTION?

- Raw or cooked food waste such as:

Table scraps, Fruits and vegetables, Meat with bones and fat, Fish with bones, Seafood, Eggs and shells, Pasta, bread and cereals, Desserts and sweets, Solid milk products (cheese, butter and yogurt), Coffee grains as well as regular tea and herb tea grains and tea bags, etc.

- Soiled paper and cardboard waste such as: Facial tissues, Paper towels, Paper napkins, Paper tablecloths, Soiled food wrappers Pizza or chicken boxes, etc.

WHAT'S NOT ACCEPTED FOR COMPOSTING FOOD WASTE COLLECTION

- 1) Recyclable materials (reserved for recycling collection)
- 2) Garden waste (possible for private home composting)
- 3) Liquids (soup, milk, juice, coffee, etc.)
- 4) Hazardous household waste for the eco-centres, such as paint and motor oil
- 5) Garbage to be disposed of in household waste bags, such as Chewing gum, Diapers and sanitary napkins or pads, Vacuum cleaner dust, Cigarette and cigar butts and ashes, Animal litter, etc.

Please note that some of the compostable materials collected by the City of Montreal may not be appropriate for smaller private home composting, such as meats and milk products which may attract animals, or cardboard waste which may not breakdown properly.
